<b>Grantee Report</b>	<p>Highlights from the report include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Updates and Announcements</li> <li>• The Planning Council discussed moving the Robert B. Green Campus FFACTS Clinic to the East Side Campus. The new clinic would continue to provide excellent patient care, protect patient confidentiality and be easily accessible for clients.</li> <li>• Received HRSA NOGA on January 26, 2018 for partial funding.</li> <li>• Maricela McQueen began her duties as the Senior Quality Data Analyst on January 8, 2018. An interim UHS staff person will assist to train Ms. McQueen in her new position to be able to conduct ARIES training, deliver technical assistance, and reporting.</li> <li>• The Director participated in two planning meetings in the month of January for the Texas Black Women's Initiative (TxBWI) – WORTH Life conference, scheduled on March 10, 2018. The mission of the TxBWI is to promote active, engaged, and empowered communities to address HIV disparity among Black women and other women of color related to HIV prevention and care and to achieve sustainable systemic change.</li> <li>• The Health Collaborative (THC) and Ryan White Program held two meetings in January to plan for a Housing Workshop, Housing Summit, and Providing Seamless Services Training; all scheduled in the month of February, 2018. The Health Collaborative will also be assisting with updating the San Antonio HIV Health Services Planning Council Red Mini-Resource Guide through the assistance of local interns with THC and the Center for Healthcare Services.</li> <li>• The committee called End Stigma, End HIV Alliance (ESEHA Alliance) met twice in the month of January. The Alliance has organized facilitated trainings for the committees/taskforces identified to be responsible for the fast track cities goal. These trainings will help the groups to strategize, organize, and create matrices to log continual progress.</li> <li>• Ryan White Staff participated in a conference call on January 9, 2018 with Ann Wright, a sub-contracted editor for HRSA in order to provide details on the successful partnerships in the SATGA. The information will be showcased in an article in the Care Action Newsletter.</li> <li>• The Director for Ryan White Part A/B and Director for Part D toured the new BEAT AIDS "Care Clinic" and met the attending physician, Dr. Garcia on January 17, 2018. Although the clinic is not supplanted with Ryan White funding, it will be a key source of health services to support the HIV care continuum.</li> </ul>

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|  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In support of the annual National Women and Girls HIV/AIDS Awareness Day (NWGHAAD), the Ryan White Part A/B Director attended two planning meetings on January 23 and 31, 2018 led by Ryan White Part D. The meetings are held to discuss location, media, resources, and additional details for the celebration/commemoration of this National Day.</li> <li>• Remote training on the usage of HarborPath, a medication assistance program for uninsured HIV patients who are awaiting status of their ADAP application, was held on January 11 and January 12, 2018 for sub-recipients BEAT AIDS* and Alamo Area Resource Center, respectively. The usage of the program will be trended for all five Ryan White sub-recipients.</li> <li>• *BEAT AIDS does not currently utilize HarborPath; however, they opened their new clinic on December 20th, and house a pharmacy.</li> <li>• The HIV/Syphilis Testing Taskforce was held on January 3, 2018 with 20 attendees. Attendees participated in an activity to share stories of their hopes and reasons why they do the work they do; expectations of taskforce members for 2018; and ways for each testing agency to collaborate in order to produce deliverables for the Fast Track Cities Initiative. (The HIV/Syphilis Testing Taskforce is designated to be responsible for the first 90% of the Fast Track Cities Initiative – “90% of people living with HIV know their HIV status.”) A facilitated meeting with a consultant to help the Taskforce develop measures for the Fast Track Cities is scheduled on February 21, 2018.</li> <li>• The End Stigma, End HIV Alliance (ESEHA) committee met in the month of January. The Ryan White Director attended the meeting to further discuss progress and monitoring in the goal to reach 90-90-90 by 2020. San Antonio’s current progress is 86 – 72 – 85.</li> <li>• The applications for DSHS/ADAP were revised for 2018 and scheduling reminders on birthdate recertification were forwarded to sub-recipients in January.</li> </ul> |
